Development of the Joint Energy Charter Secretariat-Islamic Development Bank Energy Investment Risk Assessment Report 2023

Deadline for applications: 3 February 2023

Description of the Energy Investment Risk Assessment (EIRA) report:

In 2018, the Energy Charter Secretariat (ECS) launched its flagship publication – EIRA – to assist governments in identifying legal and regulatory risks to energy investments and provide them with policy recommendations to mitigate them.

The EIRA report guides governments in adopting upfront best practices to help them design robust and resilient regulatory mechanisms and structures. Until now, EIRA has assessed legal and regulatory risks to energy investment in over 46 countries.

The target audience of EIRA is policymakers. Additionally, the report seeks to give the energy industry, investors, and the financial sector insight into the investment climate of the assessed countries. It highlights the most recent legislative, policy and regulatory changes introduced by governments to attract clean energy investment and create the right enabling environment.

Objectives and tasks:

Per Activity B22 of the ECS Programme of Work 2023, the ECS will prepare a special Joint Energy Charter Secretariat-Islamic Development Bank Energy Investment Risk Assessment report in 2023. The report will contain risk assessments of five countries.

To complete these risk assessments, the consultant, under the supervision of the Deputy Secretary-General of the ECS, will:

- Liaise with government and non-government counterparts to collect country-specific data for the EIRA questionnaire (for guidance, please see the questionnaire in EIRA 2022)
- Conduct comprehensive desk research and analysis on the participating countries' policy, legal and regulatory framework for investments in the energy sector following the EIRA scope and methodology (for guidance, please see EIRA 2022)
- Review, validate and synthesise country data in the required format (for guidance, please see the country profiles in EIRA 2022)

Outputs and deadlines:

- The duration of the consultancy is three months
- The consultancy is scheduled to commence in March 2023

Essential requirements:

- Advanced university degree in energy law or energy policy. A first-level university degree combined with qualifying experience may be accepted instead of an advanced university degree.
- At least three years of research experience in energy and investment laws, policies and regulations
- Proven experience producing reports or peer-reviewed publications related to energy law and/or policy
- Excellent written and oral command of English

Desirable requirements:

- Experience in qualitative analysis of national-level renewable energy and energy efficiency policies
- Relevant work experience in West and North Africa

Working methods for the consultant:

- The consultant will be present at the ECS headquarter on a full-time basis for the duration of the consultancy
- The consultant commits to devote full time to the project and meeting the deadlines set by the ECS
